APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION PACKET FOR TRACK I AND TRACK II FALL 2012 NURSING PROGRAM

Thank you for your interest in the San Juan College Nursing program. Attached is the application packet for the Track I and Track II selection for the Fall 2012 class. Please read the information carefully and complete all sections of the application. Incomplete applications will not be processed. It is your responsibility to be aware of any new prerequisite changes.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

TRACK I: This is a two year program leading to an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN). This nursing program option is offered in the traditional semester format over the course of 24 months. Class and clinical sessions meet mainly during daytime hours. This program track option is offered every year.

TRACK II: This program track option provides students an alternative course of study leading to an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) and is offered every other year on even years. Students will be able to complete the non-traditional course of study in 18 months, which includes a summer session. The curriculum course requirements are identical to the Track I ADN Program option, but the methods of learning may include late afternoon and evening class and clinical sessions.

Students who complete both the Track I or Track II program options will be eligible to take the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX-RN) for licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN), and may continue on to enroll in a baccalaureate degree in a nursing (BSN) program offered at select four-year institutions.

INFORMATION FOR FALL 2012 SELECTION

PROGRAM SELECTION REQUIREMENTS – TRACK I

To be eligible for the nursing program TRACK I selection process, students must have:

1. A minimum high school or college cumulative GPA of 2.75, or comparable GED score. The GPA requirement must be fulfilled at the end of the fall semester prior to the application deadline. College GPA is based on a current cumulative GPA with a minimum of 12 non-remedial credits, those numbered 110 or higher. If a student does not have a minimum of 12 non-remedial college credits, high school GPA will be calculated into the total current GPA.
2. Enrolled as a San Juan College student. <http://www.sanjuancollege.edu/pages/3535.asp>
3. Taken the Accuplacer (ACC) exam and completed appropriate courses according to San Juan College policy as described in the college catalog. The most recent Accuplacer score will determine the required courses.
4. Completed two semesters of high school chemistry within the past 5 years with a grade of "C" or higher in each semester OR completed college level chemistry with a grade of "C" or higher OR enroll in college chemistry no later than the spring semester, prior to beginning the nursing program. If enrolled in Chemistry in the spring semester (Spring 2012) at a college other than San Juan College, submit verification of enrollment to the Nursing Department.
5. Taken the ATI TEAS V (*Test of Essential Academic Skills Version V*) Exam and obtained the minimum eligible *Adjusted Individual Total Score* of 64% or higher. Topics for this exam include reading, math, science and English. Study guides are available in the SJC Bookstore or can be ordered on the ATI (Assessment Technologies Institute) website: <http://www.atitesting.com>. Additional preparation resources include practice exams available through the ATI website and tutoring assistance in the San Juan College Center for Student Engagement. The exam may be taken once per test period with a recommended 6 week interval between exams. If a student has tested during both testing periods, the highest eligible score will be used. Scores must be submitted by deadline.
6. Submitted a complete nursing program application. NOTE: If reapplying for selection, a new application is required. Applications received in the nursing department after the February 3, 2012 application deadline will not be eligible for the selection process.

PROGRAM SELECTION REQUIREMENTS – TRACK II

To be eligible for the nursing program TRACK II selection process, students must have:

1. Completed steps 1 through 6 of the above listed Track I Program Selection Requirements
2. Completed all science courses by the end of the spring 2012 semester. (CHEM 110, BIOL 224, BIOL 252, BIOL 253,) with a grade of 'C' or higher. (BIOL 224, BIOL 252 & BIOL 253 must not be older than 5 years).
3. Completed all other general education courses with the exception of one three-credit hour course by the end of the summer semester prior to admission (PSYC 120, PSYC 230, ENGL 111, ENGL 211 or ENGL 218, two three-credit hour approved electives). Eligible courses that may be taken during the first program semester are: PSYC 230, or ENGL 211 or 218, or one three-credit hour approved elective.

PROGRAM PRE-REQUISITE REQUIREMENTS – TRACK I

1. BIOL 224 – Microbiology (no older than 5 years/no older than spring 2007). BIOL 121 is a pre-requisite for this course. To fulfill this pre-requisite two semesters of high school biology must have been completed within the past 5 years with a grade of “C” or higher OR completion of college BIOL 121 or equivalent with a grade of “C” or higher.
2. BIOL 252 - Human Anatomy and Physiology I (no older than 5 years/no older than spring 2007). BIOL 121 is a pre-requisite for this-course. To fulfill this pre-requisite two semesters of high school biology must have been completed within the past 5 years with a grade of “C” or higher OR completion of college BIOL 121 or equivalent with a grade of “C” or higher.
3. Maintain a GPA of 2.75 in order to start NURS 125.
4. Demonstrate competence in the 21 Basic Nursing Skills. Students will complete the 21 Basic Nursing Skills requirement after notification of acceptance into the program. Skills completion is scheduled at the end of the spring semester.

PROGRAM PRE-REQUISITE REQUIREMENTS – TRACK II

1. BIOL 224 – Microbiology (no older than 5 years/ no older than spring 2007).). BIOL 121 is a pre-requisite for this course. To fulfill this pre-requisite two semesters of high school biology must have been completed within the past 5 years with a grade of “C” or higher OR completed college BIOL 121 or equivalent with a grade of “C” or higher.
2. BIOL 252 - Human Anatomy and Physiology I (no older than 5 years/ no older than spring 2007). BIOL 121 is a pre-requisite for this course. To fulfill this pre-requisite two semesters of high school biology must have been completed within the past 5 years with a grade of “C” or higher OR completed college BIOL 121 or equivalent with a grade of “C” or higher.
3. BIOL 253 – Human Anatomy and Physiology II (no older than 5 years no older than spring 2007/).
4. All other general education courses with the exception of one three-credit hour course must be completed by the end of the summer semester prior to admission into NURS 125 (PSYC 120, PSYC 230, ENGL 111, ENGL 211 or ENGL 218, two three-credit hour approved electives). Eligible courses that may be taken during the first program semester are: PSYC 230, or ENGL 211 or 218, or one three-credit hour approved elective.
5. Maintain a GPA of 2.75 in order to start NURS 125.
6. Demonstrate competence in the 21 Basic Nursing Skills. Students will complete the 21 Basic Nursing Skills requirement after notification of acceptance into the program. Skills completion is scheduled at the end of the spring semester.

APPLICATION PROCESS – TRACK I and TRACK II

The following must be received in the Nursing Department

No Later Than 5:00 pm Friday, February 3, 2012

- Submit a completed SJC Nursing Program **Application** to the **Nursing Department**. The application can be submitted in person during business hours or by postal mail at any time during the current application period (September 2011 – February 3, 2012). Indicate Track preference where applicable (must meet selection requirements if choosing Track II preference).
- Submit **official transcripts** from high school and any other colleges to the San Juan College Enrollment Office (Admission and Records Office), 4601 College Blvd., Farmington, NM 87402. The Admissions Office will evaluate previous college transcripts for possible transfer credit. An updated transcript will need to be requested and sent to San Juan College Admissions/ Records at the end of the semester if course work is completed at a college other than San Juan College during the fall 2011 and/or spring 2012 semester.
- View the online **Nursing Information Session-2012** and submit a record of attendance. Previous information sessions do not apply due to updated information concerning the application process. The attendance requirement may be met by completing the on-line session through the San Juan College Nursing web page <http://www.sanjuacollege.edu/nursing>. Complete the evaluation form that is provided at the end of the session. If there are additional questions after reading the application packet and viewing the information session, fill in the area for additional questions on the evaluation form and include your name and contact information. Complete the attendance form and include all requested information. Email address should be the San Juan College email if a current SJC student/completed SJC enrollment process. A correct email address is required in order to receive a confirmation receipt of attendance which will be sent as an email reply within several business days.
- Submit verification of enrollment in **Chemistry** during the spring 2012 semester if course location is other than San Juan College (if applicable).
- Those applying to Track II will also need to submit verification of additional required pre-requisite course enrollment during the spring 2012 semester if course location is other than San Juan College.
- Complete the **TEAS V Exam** and submit score results to the nursing department.

On-Campus testing – Instructions on scheduling the *TEAS V* exam in the San Juan College Testing Center are included in this application packet. Unofficial cores may be printed through your ATI account for submission to the nursing department. Official scores will be obtained by the nursing department if testing on-campus and then matched with the unofficial scores.

Off-campus/Remote testing - Instructions on scheduling the *TEAS V* exam remotely through the San Juan College Testing Center are included in this application packet. If scheduling the exam at a testing center that will not be conducted remotely through the San Juan College Testing Center, an **official** score result transcript(s) is required. Request an official *TEAS V* transcript(s) through the ATI online store be sent to the nursing department. Unofficial score results for all off-campus testing are also required to be submitted to the nursing department and can be printed through your ATI account. Official scores are then matched with the unofficial scores.

Only official score results received from ATI will be used for selection point calculation.

SELECTION

Selection of students to the SJC nursing program is based on a point system. Students are ranked according to total points. Nursing Program slots are filled beginning with the highest ranking students. (Please see specific formulas used for selection below).

Students will be notified of acceptance into the nursing program by mail in April 2012. Applicants who have not met the basic program eligibility requirements will also be contacted by mail regarding their status.

Once students have confirmed their acceptance, a detailed information packet will be mailed to them with specific instructions and guidelines regarding the requirements that need to be completed prior to starting the NURS 125 course. One component of these requirements includes demonstrating competence in the 21 Basic Nursing Skills. Those skills and options are outlined in this packet.

1. GPA - GPA is taken from the most current (or combined) transcript(s) having a minimum total of 12 non-remedial college credits and verified through the San Juan College Admissions and Records Office. A maximum of 45% of points will be awarded based on the cumulative GPA.
2. *ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills V (TEAS V) score.* A maximum of 50% of points will be awarded based on the Adjusted Individual Total Score.
3. Residence status: Calculated as of application deadline. Guidelines for residence status will follow San Juan College determination guidelines which can be found in the San Juan College 2011-2012 Academic Catalog, page(s) 34-35. The Academic Catalog can be obtained from the Admissions and Records Office or can be viewed online: <http://www.sanjuancollege.edu>. Please refer residence status questions to the Admission and Records Office at 505-566-3545. A maximum of 5% of points will be awarded based on residence status.

The total points of the aforementioned components are calculated as follows:

$$\text{TEAS V Pre-Admission Examination: } \frac{\text{Adjusted Individual Total Score} \times 500}{100} = \text{Points for TEAS}$$

Residence Status: In-state status = 50 Points for Residence
Special residency status = 50 Points for Residence
Out-of-state residency status = 0 Points for Residence

OPTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE NURSING PROGRAM 21 BASIC SKILLS REQUIREMENT

Applicants selected to enter the Nursing Program in the Fall of 2012 have four (4) options for demonstrating competence in the 21 Basic Skills. If you do not pass the 21 Basic Skills requirements, you will not be able to enter the Nursing Program.

Option # 1 CHALLENGE THE COMPETENCE DEMONSTRATION

The selected applicants who have met one of the following criteria are eligible for the Challenge Demonstration:

- Enrolled in PNUR 110 or PNUR 111 during Spring 2012 semester (will demonstrate skills with course completion)
- successfully completed a PNUR 110/Certified Nurse Aide course in the Fall 2011 semester
- successfully completed the Career Technical Education program within the past year
- hold a current Certified Nurse Aide certificate (documentation requested)
- currently employed as a nursing assistant (documentation requested)

THE SKILLS CHALLENGE IS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY AND WILL BE SCHEDULED DURING THE WEEK OF
APRIL 23, 2012 – APRIL 27, 2012

There is no cost for this demonstration. If you do not pass the demonstration challenge you are required to successfully complete the 3-WEEK SKILLS CLASS in order to enter the Nursing Program.

Option # 2 TAKE A 3-WEEK SKILLS CLASS

This class option is ONLY for applicants who have been selected into the Nursing Program and will be registered on a permission only basis
