

**NURSING**  
**WEEKEND/EVENING/ALTERNATIVE (WEA) ADN PROGRAM**  
**Catalog 2005-2007**

San Juan College offers Nursing students an alternative course of study leading to an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) through the Weekend/Evening/Alternative (WEA) Associate Degree in Nursing Program. Students will be able to complete this non-traditional course of study in 16-18 months, which includes a summer session. Students who complete the Program will be eligible to take the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX-RN) for licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN), and may continue to a baccalaureate degree in nursing (BSN) program offered at some four-year institutions. The Weekend/Evening/Alternative curriculum is identical to the existing ADN Program at San Juan College, but the methods of learning will include weekend and evening classes and on-line class content. All General Education and science classes that are required for the ADN degree must be completed by the end of the Fall semester prior to admission to the WEA ADN Program.

Nursing is a selective major. Specific requirements must be met in order to declare a pre-nursing/nursing major. For additional information contact the Office of Admissions and Records or the Nursing Department.

**Program Eligibility Requirements:**

1. Minimum high school or college cumulative GPA of 2.75, or comparable GED scores. The GPA requirement must be fulfilled at the end of the fall semester prior to application deadline. College GPA is based on a minimum of 12 non-remedial credits, those numbered 110 or higher.
2. Taken the Accuplacer, complete appropriate courses according to SJC's policy as described in the college catalog, and register as a SJC student.
3. Completed two semesters of high school chemistry within the past five years with a grade of "C" or better OR completed college level chemistry with a grade of "C" or better OR enroll in college chemistry no later than the spring semester, prior to beginning the nursing program, to be eligible for selection.
4. Place in the 50th percentile (composite) or higher on the NLN Pre-Admission Examination-RN.
5. All General Education and science classes that are required for the ADN degree must be completed by the end of the Fall semester prior to admission to the WEA ADN Program.

**Prerequisites and General Education Courses are: PSYC 120, BIOL 252, BIOL 258, BIOL 224, PSYC 230, ENGL 111, ENGL 218 or 211, HLTH 118 and a three credit hour ELECTIVE 110 or above.**

**Skills Competency**

Following selection into the WEA ADN Nursing Program the student must demonstrate competency in 21 basic nursing skills prior to beginning NURS 110. For additional information contact the Nursing Department. Enrollment in nursing courses is limited to those who have been accepted into the Nursing Program. A grade of "C" or better must be achieved in every course required in the curriculum.
