The Diesel Technology Program provides the student with the necessary skills and theory to enter either the medium/heavy duty truck or the construction/mining equipment service and repair fields. The program is flexible to allow the student to plan a schedule to meet his/her needs. Students receive a satisfactory rating through a combination of competency based task accomplishments and written testing. **Co-requisite classes must be taken together.**

Notes: Students may enter this program at any semester. See semester schedule for classes offered. Students must provide his/her own tools. To obtain a list of the required tools, contact the program instructor. A student must earn a grade of "C" or higher in all courses to receive a certificate or degree in all classes. Attendance is 25 percent of the final grade.
