There are two options available for students interested in a career in Carpentry, a two-year Associate of Applied Science Degree and a one-year certificate. Students will prepare for work in both rough and finish carpentry. Besides learning to read and understand blueprints and instructions from architects and builders, students practice estimating costs and time requirements needed to finish various projects. In rough carpentry, students practice skills by erecting various frame structures. In finish carpentry, students will set door units and cabinets. Students build a house as part of their laboratory experience.

Note: This program requires that the student purchase his/her own tools. To obtain a list of required tools, contact the program instructor, 566-3336.

Note: Students must earn a grade of "C" or higher in all courses in order to receive a degree or certificate.
