San Juan College offers an On-Campus and an On-Line Physical Therapy Assistant Program leading to an Associate of Applied Science Degree. Each PTA program accepts 20 students every year. Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to take the National Physical Therapy Assistant Licensing Examination. PTAs must be licensed in order to practice in most states.

The application deadline for both programs is August 1 of each year. For a program application, please download one from: www.sanjuancollege.edu/pta or contact the PTA Program at (505) 566-3425. Acceptance into either program is based on the admissions criteria outlined in the program application. Both PTA Programs start in January of each year. Students must complete all prerequisites prior to starting the PTA Program.

- *** MATH 096 – Introductory Algebra or higher or a Math Accuplacer is the prerequisite for PHYS 111. The Physics requirement must be 4 credits.
- **** Prerequisite is BIOL 112 is a prerequisite to PTAP 115. PTAP 115 is offered summer and fall semester prior to starting the PTA Program in January, if accepted based on the selection process.

All science classes must be current within five years.

(L) On-Line students are required to be at San Juan College approximately 7-14 days (including weekends) per lab course toward the end of each semester. * Full-time clinical externships may be completed during one semester or over three semesters.
