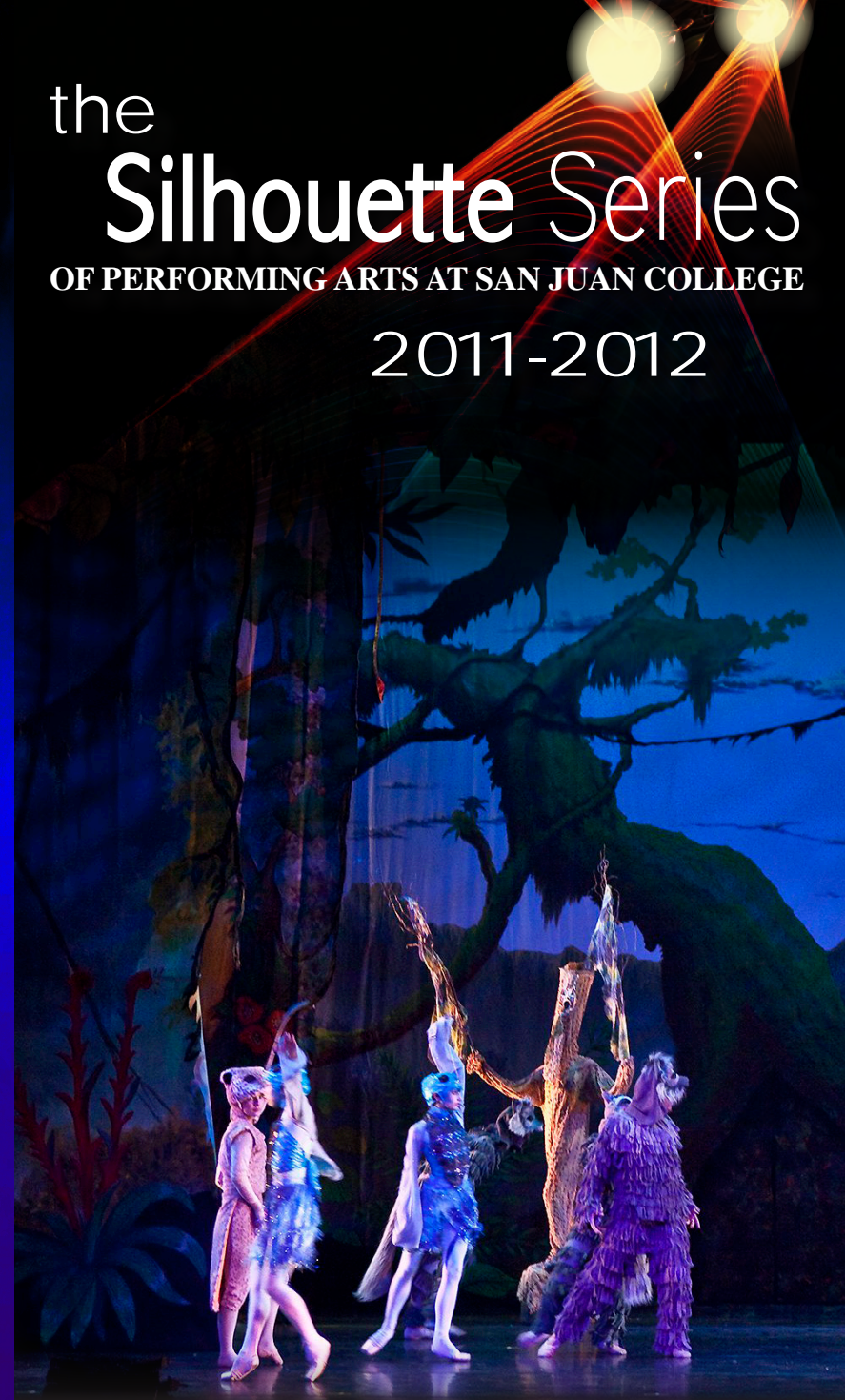

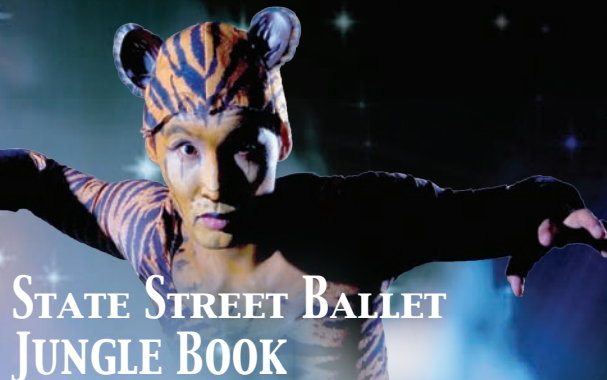

## Chautauqua Schedule for 2011-12

September 23, 7 p.m., Little Theatre – Bill Martin portrays Harry Houdini in *Harry Houdini: Mystery, Myth and Magic*. Houdini's daring and dangerous escapes became metaphors for personal freedom and newfound belief for thousands of immigrants struggling to make their way to America.

October 28, 7 p.m., Little Theatre – Allan J. Wheeler portrays William Becknell in *William Becknell: Father of the Santa Fe Trail*. The trapper and explorer founded the Santa Fe Trail while on a quest to get money to pay off the debts that landed him in debtor's prison in Franklin, Missouri.

February 10, 7 p.m., Little Theatre – Larry Marken portrays Old Bill Williams in *William Sherley – Old Bill Williams*. A colorful, adventuresome and proficiently literate 19<sup>th</sup> century western mountain man, he preached, trapped, traded, scouted for military expeditions, guided wagon trains and served as an interpreter of Native American languages.

March 2, 7 p.m., Little Theatre – VanAnn Moore portrays Jeanette MacDonald in *Jeanette MacDonald: The Queen of Song and the Movie Operetta in America*.
