Program Description

San Juan College Program in Medical Technology offers a Phlebotomy certificate that prepares students with entry level competencies to practice as a phlebotomist in a variety of settings including hospitals, clinics, and physician offices. The curriculum prepares learners to perform phlebotomy procedures, specimen collection and processing. Proper specimen collection and handling is a major key in providing quality analyses used in the maintenance of health and the diagnosis and monitoring of disease and treatment.

Students who successfully complete the program will be eligible to take the national certification examination.
