Associate of Arts

The Associate of Arts degree is intended for transfer to a four-year baccalaureate granting institution. Those wishing to transfer to a baccalaureate granting institution and pursue a degree program in Liberal Arts are strongly encouraged to check with their advisor and carefully coordinate their coursework at San Juan College with the requirements of the transfer institution. In general, however, it is suggested that students complete the New Mexico Transfer Module as outlined below. A grade of C or better is required.

Sciences	3
One general science from a subject area not used to fulfill the laboratory science requirement, i.e. anthropology (ANTH 211- Biological Anthropology) astronomy, biology, chemistry, computer science, geology, and physics. The following applied computer courses will not meet this requirement: COSC 116, 125, 135, 185, 214, 216, 223 and 225.	
Social and Behavioral Science	3
One additional course from the following subjects: anthropology, economics, geography, political science, psychology, and sociology.	
Electives	20
Any course numbered 110 and above. Students transferring to four year schools should carefully consult with their advisors for appropriate classes that can transfer for a specific major to their intended transfer institution.
