

GEOL-276 Environmental Geology 3 cr.
Earth processes that affect man and his works. Properties of rocks and soil; use and application of environmental geological data. Offered: On Demand.

GERM-111 Elementary German I 4 cr.
Develops listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Uses a communicative approach to cover vocabulary, grammar, conversation, and culture. Offered: On Demand.

GERM-112 Elementary German II 4 cr.
Continuation of GERM-111. Offered: On Demand.

HISTORY

HIST-121 Western Civilization to 1700 3 cr.
Examines the intellectual, social, economic, cultural, and political evolution of Western Civilization from the origins of the humanity to 1700. [NM Common Course Number HIST 1053, Area V: Humanities/ Fine Arts Core]. Prerequisites: Completion of ENGL-099 and RDNG-095 or appropriate Accuplacer English and Reading Scores. Offered: All.

HIST-122 Western Civilization from 1700 3 cr.
Examines the intellectual, social, economic, cultural, and political evolution of Western Civilization since 1700. [NM Common Course Number HIST 1063, Area V: Humanities/Fine Arts Core]. Prerequisites: Completion of ENGL-099 and RDNG-095 or appropriate Accuplacer English and Reading scores. Offered: All.

HIST-211 U.S. History to 1865 3 cr.
Introduces students to the history of the United States from its beginnings to the end of the Civil War. It focuses on the central themes and issues while examining the political, economic, social, intellectual and cultural developments of the era. Classes include lecture and discussion components. [NM Common Course Number HIST 1113, Area V: Humanities/Fine Arts Core]. Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-113 or appropriate Accuplacer Reading score. Corequisites: ENGL-111. Offered: All.

HIST-212 U.S. History From 1865 3 cr.
Introduces students to the history of the United States from the end of the Civil War to the present. It focuses on the central themes and issues while examining the political, economic, social, intellectual and cultural developments of the era. Classes include lecture and discussion components. [NM Common Course Number HIST 1123, Area V: Humanities/Fine Arts Core]. Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-113 or appropriate Accuplacer Reading score. Corequisites: ENGL-111. Offered: All.

HIST-221 Colonial Latin America 3 cr.
Examines the major civilizations of pre-conquest Central and South America, the Spanish and Portuguese Conquests, and the colonial history of Latin America to the completion of the independence movements of the early 19th century. Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-113 or appropriate Accuplacer Reading score. Corequisites: ENGL-111. Offered: On Demand.

HIST-222 Modern Latin America 3 cr.
Examines the nation building process of Latin America following independence in the early 19th century to the present. Latin America will be investigated in the context of the larger world community. Classes include lecture and discussion components. Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-113 or appropriate Accuplacer Reading score. Corequisites: ENGL-111. Offered: On Demand.

HIST-260 New Mexico History 3 cr.
Examines the history of New Mexico from the earliest times to the present, concentrating on the political, economic, social, and cultural changes that have occurred. [NM Common Course Number HIST 2113, Area V: Humanities/Fine Arts Core]. Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-113 or appropriate Accuplacer Reading score. Corequisites: ENGL-111. Offered: Fall & Spring.

HIST-270 Native American History and Culture 3 cr.
Introduces the history and cultures of Native peoples of North America from the earliest times to the present. The course will examine culture change and the interaction of native groups with each other and European peoples. Contemporary priorities and ongoing concerns are also examined. Prerequisites: Completion of ENGL-099 and RDNG-113 or appropriate English and Reading Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring.

HIST-272 Navajo History 3 cr.
Introduces the history of the Navajo with supporting ethnographic material. The course begins with the entrance of the Dine into the Southwest and continues to the present, with a concentration on the 20th century political and economic development. Offered in collaboration with Dine College (NIS 211). Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-095 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Accuplacer Reading and English scores. Offered: Fall.

HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

HITP-110 Medical Terminology 3 cr.
This course presents the study of the language of medicine, focusing on prefixes, suffixes, word roots and their combining forms. This course includes word construction, spelling, usage, comprehension and pronunciation. Students are provided with information regarding anatomy, symptomatology, pathology, and diagnostic/surgical procedures. Open to all SJC students. Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-095 or appropriate Reading Accuplacer score. Offered: All.

HITP-112 Human Body: Structures and Functions 4 cr.
This course introduces the student to the basic concepts of physical and chemical operation of the organs and systems of the human body. System reviews to include integumentary, skeletal, muscular, nervous, endocrine, cardiovascular, lymphatic, immune, respiratory, digestive, urinary and reproductive systems. Minimum grade required: C. Offered: All. Faculty Permission Required.

HITP-116 Computerized Business Applications 3 cr.
This course provides the student with basic computer skills including the Microsoft Office Professional package. It also covers the use of database applications and the development and use of queries. Prerequisites: Completion of RDNG-113 or appropriate Reading Accuplacer score. Offered: All.
