

LEAS-221 Family Law 3 cr.

This course will examine the social philosophy underpinning the law governing domestic relations. The course will discuss court jurisdiction, pleading and practice before juvenile and domestic courts in state and Navajo Nation courts. The law office management of domestic relations cases will be introduced. Prerequisites: LEAS-120, LEAS-121, and LEAS-123. Offered: Fall.

LEAS-222 Collection and Subrogation 3 cr.

This course will introduce the students to the practice of law concerned with the establishment and collection of creditor claims coming into the office. The process of complaint and document drafting, forum selection, obtaining and collecting judgments, accounting for sums collected, and the protection of a judgment creditor's interests will be studied. The federal Fair Debt Collection Practice Act will be studied as it applies to attorneys and other third party debt collectors. Permission of instructor required. Offered: On Demand. Faculty Permission Required.

LEAS-223 Personal Injury Practice: Legal & Medical 3 cr.

This course will deal with the legal and medical aspects of personal injury arising out of torts, workers' compensation and social security claims. Permission of instructor required. Offered: On Demand. Faculty Permission Required.

LEAS-224 Natural Resources: Oil, Gas, Min & Water 3 cr.

An introductory study of federal and state law pertaining to the acquisition, ownership, development, production and use of oil and gas, solid minerals and water rights. Emphasis on determining ownership on the basis of federal, state and county records. Permission of instructor required. Offered: On Demand. Faculty Permission Required.

LEAS-225 American Indian Law 3 cr.

Review of the historical development of American Indian and tribal law, treaties, the impact of American Indian citizenship, and the U.S. government's role in present American Indian law. Includes the study of significant court decisions and jurisdictional questions, both civil and criminal. Prerequisites: LEAS-121 and LEAS-123. Offered: Spring.

LEAS-226 Law Office Administration 3 cr.

Covers supervision of personnel, the role of support staff in the law office, law office economics, basic computer technology, office equipment and supplies, office procedures, goal setting and budgeting, and general personnel procedures and practices. Permission of instructor required. Offered: On Demand. Faculty Permission Required.

LEAS-227 Corporation & Securities Law 3 cr.

This course will cover state Blue Sky Laws and will include an introduction to the rules and procedures governing the federal Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The course will study state and SEC filings, registrations, stock issues and subscriptions. The law of insider trading will be discussed along with the other antifraud provisions of federal and state security laws. Offered: On Demand. Faculty Permission Required.

LEAS-229 Consumer Law 3 cr.

The study of legal rights and obligations pertaining to consumer transactions. State consumer protection laws, the federal Magnuson-Moss Act, UCC warranties, product or liability, and federal truth-in-lending laws will be covered. The consumer protection statutes for the Navajo Nation will be studied. Permission of instructor required. Offered: On Demand. Faculty Permission Required.

LEAS-231 Business Organization Law 3 cr.

This course will cover the law of sales from Article 2 of the Uniform Commercial Code, negotiable instruments from Articles 3 and 4 of the Uniform Commercial Code, and Secured Transactions from Article 9 of the Uniform Commercial Code. This course will provide a study of the various types of formations of business organizations from sole proprietorships, partnerships, corporations, and limited liability companies to business organizations found on the Navajo Nation. The course will also cover poverty law, including bailments and the characteristics of real and personal property. Prerequisites: Completion of LEAS-121 and LEAS-127 or take BLAW-230. Offered: Spring.

LEAS-280 Cooperative Education 3 cr.

During student's second year of paralegal studies, student will, with the prior approval of the Paralegal Program Director, intern with an attorney or with an employer in a law related occupation. The program requires approximately 160-163 clock hours of internship. The student will be supervised and rated by the employer. Offered: All. Faculty Permission Required.

LEARNING**LRNS-080 Foundational Math Accelerator 3 cr.**

In this self paced course, students utilize computer assisted learning and individual instruction to prepare for college level math courses. This course is offered as an alternative to traditional developmental math courses. When completing this course, students will retest their math skills using the Accuplacer to determine placement into higher levels of math. This course is available to students who place into MATH 050, 095, or 096, but does not replace any of these courses. Offered: All.

LRNS-095 Math 095 Skills 3 cr.

Academic support for students concurrently enrolled in Math 095 to improve math and study skills S/U grading. Course repeated w/ instructor approval. Not applicable towards degree or certificate. Corequisites: MATH-095. Offered: Fall & Spring.

LRNS-096 Math 096 Skills 3 cr.

Academic support for students concurrently enrolled in Math 096 to improve their math and study skills. S/U grading. Course repeated with instructor approval. Not applicable for degree or certificate. Corequisites: MATH-096. Offered: Fall & Spring.

LRNS-111 College Success Strategies 3 cr.

Provides an in depth opportunity for students to learn and adopt methods that promote success in college and in life. Course may be applied towards an elective for an AA degree or certificate. Offered: All.

LRNS-112 College Success for Health Careers 3 cr.

Provides an opportunity for students to learn and adopt methods that promote success in college and in life, specifically within the health science certificate and degree programs. Learning will focus on developing skills in communication, health management, diversity and relationships, test taking, time management, research techniques, basic computer skills, and basic reading skills will be covered. Career exploration within the health sciences will be covered. Students will complete 12 hours of job shadowing in the health career of their choice. Offered: Fall & Spring.

LRNS-113 Freshman Seminar 3 cr.

The Freshman Seminar is a unique transition course designed to facilitate the students' integration into the learning community of the college. The course provides an opportunity to enhance the students' skills for success in college, in life, and within this discipline. Students will explore careers within this discipline and develop academic skills and an understanding of college culture. This course fosters the students' meaningful educational engagement.

LRNS-221 Contrasting Western/Trad. Healthcare 1 cr.

Students will learn to maximize Native American history, values and culture to transition into science and healthcare courses based on western educational models. Offered: Fall & Spring.

LRNS-222 Healthcare Practices in Native Cultures 1 cr.

This course will assist students in preparing to work in Native American communities and on reservations. Students will learn how to incorporate Native American traditional beliefs and values into their practice.

LEASE OPERATOR**LSOP-111 Production Field Tech 2 cr.**

Students will study producing natural resources (oil and gas), from newly drilled and existing well locations to include: minimum surface equipment operations, wellhead design, common field terminologies, pressure gauges, location and fluid flow layout, proper use of hand tools, and equipment safety devices. Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites: MATH-095, ENGL-095 OR CPT EQUIVALENT. Offered: Fall. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-113 Surface Equipment P & M 2 cr.

Students will learn skills, techniques and procedures to properly perform routine preventative maintenance on surface production equipment. Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites: Completion of ENGL-095 and MATH-095 or appropriate English and Math Accuplacer scores. Offered: Fall. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-114 Wellhead Operation & Design 1 cr.

To provide students with techniques and procedures to correctly identify different wellhead designs and preventative maintenance routines. Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites:

Completion of Math-095 and ENGL-095 or appropriate Math and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: All.

LSOP-180 Cooperative Work Exp I 5 cr.

The students will be employed by a company in the lease operator field which will provide relevant learning experiences that are directly related to the student's most recent classroom/laboratory experiences. The student will be supervised and evaluated jointly by his/her employer and San Juan College personnel. Prerequisites: LSOP-111, LSOP-112, LSOP-113, SAFE-114, SAFE-139, and COSC-125. Offered: Fall. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-181 Cooperative Work Experience I 7 cr.

Students will be temporarily employed by a company in the oil and gas industry which will provide relevant learning experiences that are directly related to the student's most recent classroom/laboratory experiences. Students will be supervised and evaluated jointly by his/her employer and San Juan College School of Energy personnel. Prerequisites: LSOP-111, LSOP-112, LSOP-113, SAFE-114, SAFE-139, COSC-125 OR COSC-137. Offered: Fall. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-201 Basic Oil Measurement & Gauging 1 cr.

Students will study Basic methods for gauging and correctly documenting Hydrocarbon or oil tanks, inclusive of State and Federal regulatory requirements. This will include producing natural resources (oil) from newly drilled and exiting well locations. Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites: Completion of MATH-095 and ENGL-095 or appropriate Math and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-202 Basic Field Gas Measurement 2 cr.

Students will be introduced to the fundamentals of gas measurement. Includes dry flow meters and remote telecommunication units (RTU's). Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites: Completion of MATH-095 and ENGL-095 or appropriate Math and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-203 Intro to Wireline & Swab Techniques 1 cr.

Students will be introduced to wireline benefits and experience an introduction to swabbing techniques. Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites: Completion of MATH-095 and ENGL-095 or appropriate Math and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-205 Beam Lift & Chemical Pump 2 cr.

An introduction to beam lift systems design and operation. Operation and usage of chemical injection pump. Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites: Completion of MATH-095 and ENGL-095 or appropriate Math and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring. Faculty Permission Required.

LSOP-206 Reduced Production Rates 1 cr.

Introduce the student to the causes and prevention of unexpected reduced production rates. Safety will be strictly enforced. Prerequisites: Completion of MATH-095 and ENGL-095 or appropriate Math and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring. Faculty Permission Required.
