

NATIVE STUDIES**NATV-110 Introduction to Native Studies 3 cr.**

Introduction to Native Studies will examine the issues, conditions, and contexts affecting Native people in the US and throughout the Americas. Students will be exposed to an overview of the interdisciplinary field of Native Studies through examining the beliefs and world views of indigenous cultures, historical and cultural contexts, economic and sociopolitical developments, and Native communities today. Prerequisites: Completion of ENGL-095 and RDNG-095 or appropriate English and Reading Accuplacer scores. Offered: Fall.

NATV-240 Management & Leadership in Tribal Gov't 3 cr.

A study of the theories and styles of leadership, compared to the cultural theories and cultural styles of leadership of tribal leaders. Offered: Spring.

NAVAJO/NAVAJO STUDIES**NAVA-111 Elementary Navajo I 4 cr.**

Develops listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills to communicate at a basic level. Uses a communicative approach to cover vocabulary, grammar, conversation, and culture. Offered: All.

NAVA-112 Elementary Navajo II 4 cr.

Continuation of NAVA-111. Prerequisites: NAVA-111. Offered: Fall & Spring.

NAVA-115 Reading & Writing Navajo 3 cr.

For students fluent in Navajo but lacking skills in reading and writing. Offered: On Demand.

NAVA-261 Navajo Oral Trad & Styles 3 cr.

Examines philosophical thoughts discussed by Navajo elders by listening to and analyzing various oral styles including storytelling, oratory, prayers, and lectures. English and Navajo instruction. Offered in collaboration with Dine College (NIS 261). Offered: On Demand.

NNST-285 Capstone Project in NNST 1 cr. TO 4 cr.

Ties together the broad themes and issues addressed in the Native/Navajo Studies concentration. Students will either produce a substantial research paper or conduct an applied research/service learning project in collaboration with a native community. Research must be supervised by Native/Navajo Studies faculty. Required of all students who graduate with this concentration. Prerequisite: 12 credits under the Native/Navajo Studies concentration. Offered: On Demand.

NURSING**NURS-113 Adv. Placement Credit NURS 125 7 cr. TO 9 cr.**

Allows the licensed practical nurse (LPN) or transfer nursing student to receive transfer credit hours for courses taken either in a practical nursing or associate degree/baccalaureate degree nursing program. Credit hours awarded will be determined by the nursing department administration based upon scores achieved in the Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) RN content Mastery Series: Fundamentals of Nursing Practice. Requires admission into program. Offered: On Demand.

NURS-125 Nursing Concepts & Practice 1 8 cr.

This is an introductory course to pre-licensure nursing, using the Quality and Safety Education for Nursing (QSEN) competencies which provide the organizing framework for the nursing program. These competencies are: Patient Centered Care, Teamwork & Collaboration, Evidence Based Practice, Quality Improvement, Safety and Informatics. Clinical opportunities facilitate application of fundamental concepts through care of diverse populations in a variety of settings across the health care continuum. This course requires a total of 135 contact hours of lab, simulation, & clinical practice. 8(5+9P) Requires admission into program. Prerequisites: BIOL-252 & BIOL-224. Offered: Fall.

NURS-132 Advanced Placement Credit for NURS 145 5 cr. TO 7 cr.

Allows the licensed practical nurse (LPN) or transfer nursing student to receive transfer credit hours for courses taken either in a practical nursing or associate degree/baccalaureate degree nursing program. Credit hours awarded will be determined by the nursing department administration based upon transcript evaluation. Requires admission into program. Offered: On Demand.

NURS-135 Nursing Externship 4 cr.

Optional clinical course in which students are assigned to a clinical unit at SJRMC for three eight-hour days or two 12-hour days per week. Students are partnered with one to three SJRMC nurses who have been especially chosen to assist students in their learning experience. Focus is to develop student competency by providing supervised patient care opportunities. Requires admission into program. Prerequisites: NURS-145. Offered: Summer.

NURS-145 Nursing Concepts & Practice 2 9 cr.

Using the QSEN competencies, this course builds upon the fundamental concepts introduced in NURS-125 with the focus on chronic health issues across the lifespan. Clinical opportunities are designed to facilitate application of nursing concepts focusing on lifespan chronic health issues through care of diverse populations in a variety of settings. This course requires a total of 135 contact hours of lab, simulation, and clinical practice. 9(6+9P) Requires admission into program. Prerequisites: NURS-125, BIOL 253, PSYC 120. Corequisites: NURS-150. Offered: Spring.

NURS-150 Nursing Pharmacological Concepts 3 cr.

This course integrates pharmacology as therapy using the QSEN competencies to build upon foundational pharmacological concepts introduced in the first semester. Requires admission into program. Prerequisites: NURS-125, BIOL 253, PSYC 120. Corequisites: NURS-145. Offered: Spring.

NURS-205 Transition for Adv Placement 1 cr. TO 6 cr.

This course is required for all LPN's/LVN's and appropriate transfer students. Content includes philosophy, theoretical constructs, outcomes of the nursing program and LPN to RN role transition. Previous learning is evaluated. Requires admission into program. Offered: On Demand.

NURS-210 Nursing Concepts & Practice 3 9 cr.

Using QSEN competencies, this course builds upon the nursing concepts introduced in NURS 145 with focus on acute health issues across the lifespan. Clinical opportunities are designed to

facilitate application of nursing concepts and occur in a variety of health care settings. This course requires a total of 180 contact hours of lab, simulation, and clinical practice. 9(5+12P) Additionally offered summer odd years. Requires admission into program. Prerequisites: NURS-145, NURS-150, ENGL 111, PSYC 230, Approved electives 1 and 2. Offered: Fall.

NURS-220 Nursing Concepts & Practice 4 8 cr.

Using the QSEN competencies, this course prepares students for entry level nursing practice. Clinical opportunities are designed to facilitate application of nursing concepts and occur in a variety of health care settings. This course requires a total of 135 contact hours of lab, simulation, and clinical practice. 8(5+9P) Additionally offered fall odd years. Requires admission into program. Prerequisites: NURS-210, ENGL 211 or ENGL 218. Corequisites: NURS-225, NURS-230. Offered: Spring.

NURS-225 Professional Transition 1 cr.

This course will focus on what it means to be a "professional nurse" in a changing health care environment. Using QSEN competencies students will prepare to enter the nursing profession. Additionally offered in the fall of odd years. Requires admission into program. Prerequisites: NURS-210, ENGL 211 or ENGL 218. Corequisites: NURS-220, NURS-230. Offered: Spring.

NURS-230 Preceptorship 4 cr.

This course assists the student in role transition from student to entry level nurse. The student will synthesize and apply all QSEN competencies and concepts learned during the previous nursing courses. This course requires a total of 180 contact hours in lab and clinical practice. 4(12P) Additionally offered fall odd years. Successful completion of corequisites NURS-220 and NURS-225 required prior to taking this course. Prerequisites: NURS-210. Pass Corequisites NURS-220 and NURS-225. Corequisites: NURS-220, NURS-225. Offered: Spring.

NURS-261 Reiki Level I 1 cr.

An introductory course, which discusses the concepts of Reiki Energy healing including application of content and principles of Reiki healing. Hands on practice of positions for self-healing and treating others. Offered: All.

NURS-262 Reiki Level II 1 cr.

An intermediate course, which will discuss expanded concepts of Reiki Energy Healing. Students will experience hands on practice of the use of ancient symbols and hand positions for self-healing and treating others. Prerequisites: NURS-261, minimum grade C. Offered: All.

NURS-263 Reiki Level III 1 cr.

An advanced course, which will explore expanded concepts of Reiki Energy healing. Student will experience hands on practice of the use of more ancient symbols. Students will also be integrating these symbols with hand positions for self-healing and treating others. Prerequisites: NURS-262, minimum grade C. Offered: All.

OUTDOOR LEADERSHIP, EDUCATION AND RECREATION

OLER-120 Challenge Course I 3 cr.

This course is designed to introduce students to the design and application of a challenge course, and to train students in the technical skills required to instruct and sequence various activities on Low Challenge Courses. Does not meet Physical Education activity requirement for AA degree. Offered: Fall.

OLER-130 Wilderness & Environ Ethics 2 cr.

Overview of ethical practices and behavior for anyone utilizing wilderness resources. Upon successful completion of course student will be a Leave-No-Trace Trainer. This course does not meet Physical Education activity requirement for AA degree. Offered: Fall.

OLER-140 Wilderness Pursuits 2 cr.

Introductory level course with a focus on developing skills related to planning, organizing and executing backcountry outings. This course will be experiential, in that students will practice skills both in the classroom and during field time. Students will apply their learning directly by planning and participating in a backpacking expedition. Offered: Fall.

OLER-150 Wilderness First Aid 1 cr.

This class goes beyond that of traditional first aid in that it addresses how to handle medical situations in remote wilderness settings. Upon successful completion, student will be certified in Wilderness First Aid. Does not meet Physical Education activity requirement for AA degree. Offered: Fall.

OLER-155 Intro to Gym Climbing 1 cr.

For the beginning climber or one who wants a review of the basics of climbing in an indoor climbing gym. This course will cover the topics and skills necessary to safely Boulder, Top Rope, and Lead climbing at the HHPC Climbing Facility. This course is suitable for all ability levels. Meets Physical Education activity requirement for AA degree. Offered: Fall & Spring.

OLER-156 Rock Climbing 2 cr.

This course covers the fundamentals of rock climbing. Students will experience climbing at the SJC HHPC Indoor Climbing Facility and outdoor locations, learning equipment selection and usage, belay techniques, anchor systems and climbing skills. Meets Physical Education activity requirement for AA degree. Offered: Fall.

OLER-157 Sport Climbing 1 cr.

Designed for the experienced climber who wishes to gain the knowledge and skills for lead climbing in an indoor and outdoor setting. Meets Physical Education activity requirement for AA degree. Prerequisites: OLER-155 or OLER-156, or get instructor's permission. Offered: Spring.

OLER-161 Winter Backcountry Travel 2 cr.

This course is designed to cover the skills necessary for extended winter camping and travel in the backcountry on snowshoes or backcountry/telemark skis. Meets Physical Education activity requirement for AA degree. Offered: Spring.
