

POLS-265 Public Policy & Social Change 3 cr.
This course will provide an overview of the structures and processes of public policy. This course will examine how social change is brought about through the actions of various agents including interest groups, advocacy coalitions, and executive, legislative and judicial policy processes. Also listed as HMSV 265 Public Policy and Social Change. Prerequisites: Completion of ENGL-111 and RDNG-113 or appropriate English and Reading Accuplacer scores. Offered: Fall.

PSYCHOLOGY

PSYC-115 Interpersonal & Career Dev 3 cr.
An introductory study of communication and interpersonal relationships in the service occupations. Offered: Fall.

PSYC-120 Introduction to Psychology 3 cr.
Introduces students/learners to the science of human behavior and mental processes. The course will survey contemporary research and theory in psychology with the goal of broadening the students' understanding of self and others. [NM Common Course Number PSYC 1113, Area IV; Behavioral/Social Science Core] Prerequisites: Completion of ENGL-095 and RDNG-095 or appropriate English and Reading Accuplacer scores. Offered: All.

PSYC-210 Stats for Social & Behavioral Science 3 cr.
Presentation of the basic principles of statistics including description and interpretation of data. Provides an acquaintance to basic statistical principles that can be applied to the fields in the Social Sciences. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Fall.

PSYC-230 Human Development 3 cr.
Introduces learners to the study of the physical, mental, emotional, and social aspects of human development from conception through adulthood. Emphasis is placed on research and applications. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: All.

PSYC-231 Educational Psychology 3 cr.
Introduces learners to various applications of psychological theory and research in educational settings and the learning processes. Prerequisites: Take PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Corequisites: ENGL-111, RDNG-113. Offered: On Demand.

PSYC-240 Social Psychology 3 cr.
Introduces learners to the scientific study of how thoughts, feelings, and behaviors of individuals are influenced by other people. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Fall.

PSYC-245 Brain & Behavior 3 cr.
Introduces students to the field of biological psychology or behavioral neuroscience. Students will learn anatomy, physiology, and chemistry of the nervous system and their relationships to behavior. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and

ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Fall.

PSYC-246 Drugs and Behavior 3 cr. TO 3 cr.
Introduces the student to the effects of drugs on behavior. Brain-behavior interactions and how drugs affect this interaction will be presented. This course is co-listed with HMSV-246. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring.

PSYC-265 Abnormal Psychology 3 cr.
An introduction to the study of adjustment failures. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Fall & Spring.

PSYC-270 Human Sexuality 3 cr.
Introduces learners to an exploration of the physiological, psychological, and sociological factors that influence sexual behavior, sex roles, and sexual identity. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring.

PSYC-275 Theories of Personality 3 cr.
Introduces learners to the major theories in the development of personality. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: Spring.

PSYC-286 Cognitive Psychology 3 cr.
Study of cognitive abilities such as attention, memory, problem solving comprehension, categorization and reasoning. Prerequisites: PSYC-120. Complete RDNG-113 and ENGL-099 or appropriate Reading and English Accuplacer scores. Offered: On Demand.

PTAP-110 Intro to Phys Therapist Asst 3 cr.
Introduction to the role of the PTA, PT, and other health care providers. Prerequisites: Acceptance into the PTA program. Offered: Spring.

PTAP-116 Musculoskeletal Focus for PTA's 3 cr.
Enrollment restricted to prospective PTA students only. Basic anatomy of the musculoskeletal system. The spring course is held over twelve weeks and begins at the end of March and ends in mid-July. Instructor consent required. Prerequisites: BIOL-112. Offered: Fall and Spring. Faculty Permission Required.

PTAP-125 Clinical Kinesiology 4 cr.
Advanced anatomy of the musculoskeletal and nervous systems. Prerequisite: Acceptance into the PTA program. Offered: Spring.

PTAP-130 Pathophysiology for A/H Student 3 cr.
Introduction to the function, anatomical components, and pathologies of each system within the human body. Prerequisite: Acceptance into the PTA Program. Offered: Spring and Summer.
