# SAN JUAN COLLEGE BOARD POLICY

Policy No. 701

SECTION: Student Services POLICY TOPIC: Admissions

## I. <u>Admissions</u>

San Juan College is an independent two-year comprehensive community college having as a major part of its fundamental mission, the provision of serving the needs and making accessible postsecondary education to members of the community. In order to fulfill this mission, the College has an open-door policy for admission of students in credit courses and programs who have graduated from an accredited high school, completed a General Education Development (GED) certificate, or who, through age and experience, qualify for admission, as well as opportunities for high school juniors and seniors and dual credit qualified students. San Juan College non-credit course admission shall be in accordance with program procedures and admission policies as described herein.

### II. Admission Requirements

General admission requirements and program admission requirements-will be outlined in the *College Catalog* and *Student Handbook*. General admission procedures shall be under the direct supervision of the Dean of Students and subject to review and action by the Vice President for Student Services. Specialized accreditation and/or selective program admission requirements will be under the direct supervision of the Dean of the school and subject to review and action by the Vice President for Student the direct supervision of the Dean of the school and subject to review and action by the Vice President for Learning.

### III. Equal Access

San Juan College is committed to providing equal access to all students who make use of College programs and services. San Juan College will comply with federal and state laws and regulations, including the Title VII Civil Rights Act of 1964 and 1990, Executive Order 11246 Section 504 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act, the Age Discrimination Act of 1967, the Americans with Disability Act of 1990, as amended, the Vietnam Era Veteran's Readjustment Act of 1974, and Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972.

## IV. Admissions Appeal

If an applicant feels that he/she has been unjustly denied admission to the College, he/she shall follow an appeals process as outlined in the *College Catalog*.
